Welcome to Morpheus Theatre's 26th Season of Shows Worth Seeing! As we continue with our second quarter century, we know that the season ahead is unlike any that we have

presented before. I am excited to be exploring a variety of new delivery formats and to keep theatre going in any way possible. Thank you to the cast and crew of **A Christmas Carol** for joining us on this journey and helping to teach me new ways to create theatre.

I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to the cast and crew of this production. Although we only had a fourweek rehearsal period, our plans for this production and our approach to rehearsals changed several times during those four weeks. We had originally planned for two weeks of online rehearsals and two weeks of in-person rehearsals focused on blocking, working with the sound effects,

and practicing the overlapping dialog. Items which just cannot be rehearsed online. We ultimately pivoted to 4 weeks of online rehearsal, and I truly feel that the time spent in rehearsal made the time in the recording studio go extremely smooth.

I would also like to thank the production team. We had assembled a strong group of designers and crew that were ready to work within the new health guidelines to ensure that this production was presented safely and gave the audience a sense of familiarity at Christmas. With the shift to an online only production, work that was already completed, such as building the set, would not be used. And we had several other plans and designs that would never be seen by the audience. At the same time, we now had larger roles for some, and new designers were added to help build out the online production.

Thank you all for your contributions to Morpheus Theatre's version of **A Christmas Carol**. I hope you enjoy the show.

COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Morpheus Theatre would like our patrons to know that we observed Alberta's recommended health guidance and safety protocols at every step of the process. The health and wellbeing of every member of our cast, crew and audience was our primary concern.

These protocols included:

- ♦ The audition process was completely online
- ♦ All rehearsals were held over Zoom. Had we been allowed to rehearse in person, we would have adhered to daily health checks, capacity limits, face masks, hand sanitizer, cleaning of all surfaces & props, restricted use of props, and physical distancing
- ♦ All production meetings were held over Zoom
- Costume sizing was done by questionnaire.
 All costumes were pulled, quarantined, and separated into boxes for each cast member
- ♦ Recording of the show was done at a professional recording studio. All cast and crew adhered to a health check, physical distancing and wearing of face masks at all times except when at individual microphones. Microphone and music stands were regularly cleaned and cleaned between performers. Breaks were scheduled to allow the recording studio to "exchange the air".

- All microphones were physically distanced in the studio. When distancing was not possible (group scenes), all performers wore face masks.
- ♦ Crew members wore face masks at all times and maintained physical distancing.
- ♦ The recording schedule was optimized to minimize the number of people called at any one time and to reduce the amount of time that cast were required to be at the recording studio.
- Performances were moved to online only as per provincial requirements.
- Had in-person performances been allowed, Morpheus Theatre and the Pumphouse Theatre had worked to establish several protocols to ensure physical distancing, minimal contact with ticket scanning, face masks while in the venue and seated, and one-way traffic throughout the venue.
